CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Pro-Temp Michael Weatherman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND MAIL RECEIVED

As there were no Announcements or Mail Received, City Council moved on to Public Comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT

<u>PUBLIC HEARING - ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT TO ALLOW TANNERY IN THE INDUSTRIAL, C2 AND C3 ZONES.</u>

Planning Commission Chair Jody Emra stated the Planning Commission held a public hearing to discuss changes to the zoning text and the zoning matrix to allow a tannery and voted to recommend approval to City Council.

Council Member John Ridlington asked for further clarification regarding the proposed changes.

Planning Commissioner Nick Gourlie stated the C in the matrix stands for a conditional use permit which would be required for a tannery in all zones. It is a way to review the tannery processes and chemical use. He further stated quarterly tests will be performed to monitor chemicals being deposited into the Wastewater Treatment plant.

Mr. Josh Judd explained he receives the skins that are in a dried state. Everything he does is hair on. 90% of what they do is wholesale. Alison with Esvelt Environmental Engineering reviewed all the chemicals used and declared everything is such

small quantities it is not an issue with the Wastewater Treatment plant.

Council Member Cliff King asked if anything would be outside of the building such as salt. Mr. Josh stated no, it is all kept within the building and properly disposed of. The skins are already dried.

Mayor Pro-Temp Michael Weatherman opened the Public Hearing to Public Comment at 7:16 p.m.

Mr. Phil Adams, stated he has been to many tanneries and Mr. Judds tannery is very nice and clean.

Mayor Pro-Temp Michael Weatherman closed the public hearing for public comment at 7:17 p.m.

TOWN & COUNTRY DAYS

Ms. Shai Ahloo presented a letter and maps for 2025 Town & Country Days. This year it is scheduled for June $6^{\rm th}$ and $7^{\rm th}$. The layout will be the same as last year. Ms. Ahloo reviewed her handouts with City Council.

Meyers Street Closure

Thursday - 1 lane in front of the park. 1 lane in front of City Hall for stage set up.

Friday – At 9am street closures will be set up on Meyers from 5th street to 8th. Street closure will remain through Sunday.

Saturday - 4th Street through 5th street will be closed for the car show. This section will reopen at 2pm after the car show.

Electrical Request

Food vendors will utilize all power outlets at the park. Median outlets will be utilized for vendor lighting.

Stage will be powered from the electrical outlets at city hall.

Inflatables vendor will source the power outlets between the pool and sprinkler park.

Garbage Service

Town and Country Days is requesting the city to pay for the garbage service.

Advertising

Town and Country Days has requested \$1,000 for the lodging tax fund. This funding will be used for radio and newsprint advertising focusing on tourists 50+ miles away.

Security





I am writing to request lodging tax funds for Town and Country Days 2025. This event has a long-standing history in Kettle Falls and annually brings several thousand people to town for the two-day festival. Many of the attendees of the event are tourists that support the local economy.

The Town and Country Days Committee working under the Kettle Falls Chamber of Commerce is requesting \$1,000 to be used for marketing this festival. In 2024 our advertising expenses totaled \$2,300. We are budgeting for the same in 2025. The marketing plan includes newsprint advertisements and articles, radio broadcasting, and promoted social media marketing. A focus will be made to attract tourists to the area from 50 or more miles from Kettle Falls.

Town and Country Days has made significant growth in the amount of vendor spaces available, car show admissions, parade entries, and general attendance. This event stimulates revenue for local businesses, hotels, and restaurants, which is exactly what the lodging tax funds are intended to support.

There are already issues with chickens in town we really don't need to start allowing livestock in the city limits. The recommendation from planning commission is no.

- Paint
- Solvents
- Car Bodies
- Construction Debris
- Items Exceeding 6' Long
- Piles of Dirt/Rocks

Residents are limited to 1 fully loaded (approximately 2 cubic yard), properly secured, pick-up truck per residence.

Please note, all loads are subject to inspection with City of Kettle Falls and Sunshine Disposal approval prior to unloading.
